The participants were then organized into two groups and started new discussions. The first workshop concerned education, Erasmus and the possibility of student exchange in the future. To be able to influence, the result of the workshop has been sent to the [EU open consultation](#) concerning the future of Erasmus. The second workshop gave the participants the opportunity to get to know some useful techniques that helps improving your memory.

The project is also aiming to be a platform for networking where young people can meet to exchange ideas and cooperate with other young people in the area.
